LOWER SALFORD TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES September 6, 2023

Chairman Keith Bergman called the Lower Salford Township Board of Supervisors meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Supervisors present were Chris Canavan, Kevin Shelly, Dave Scheuren and Kent Krauss. Also present were Township Manager, Joe Czajkowski; Assistant to the Township Manager, Holly Hosterman; Director of Building and Zoning, Mike Beuke; Township Solicitor, Jim Garrity; and Township Engineer, Michele Fountain.

Chairman Bergman led all in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Comment

There was no public comment.

Consent Agenda

Supervisor Canavan moved to approve the consent agenda as presented. Supervisor Scheuren seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Chairman Bergman reminded those present that the schedule of upcoming Township meetings was listed on the bottom of the agenda.

Zoning Hearing Board

Mr. Beuke stated that there were no Zoning Hearing Board applications for the month of September.

Park Board

Holly Hosterman reported that the next Park Board meeting is scheduled for September 26^{th} at 7:00pm.

Fire Chief

Captain Mason Vasey reported that the Fire Company reported to 27 calls during the month of August and averaged 9.3 members per call. They were in service for 15 hours and 15 minutes. Captain Vasey reported that the annual open house is scheduled for October 7th and that the Company is expecting delivery of their new truck in October.

<u>Freedom Valley Medical Rescue</u> – Chief Don Lynch reported that the Ambulance service responded to 512 calls in August with 213 of those calls out of the Lower Salford Station. Don said that Freedom Valley was happy to report that their training institute graduated 64 students from their summer EMT class.

Communications Committee

Supervisor Shelly reported that the committee has recommended using the Ready Montco texting system as another avenue to provide information on the Township. Supervisor Shelly said that the next meeting of the Communications Committee was scheduled for September 20th at 7:30pm.

Recreation Authority

Chairman Bergman reported that the golf course has been doing spectacularly well, noting that the number of rounds played year to date have far exceeded the budgeted number.

 Authority Supervisor Canavan moved to approve the easement. Supervisor Scheuren seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
- F) Motion to Approve Fire Police Assistance to the Harleysville Rotary Club for the Annual Halloween Parade on Saturday, October 21, 2023 Supervisor Canavan moved to approve the assistance. Supervisor Scheuren Seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
- G) Motion to Approve Fire Police Assistance to Eckhart Auto Body for their Car Exhibit and Open House on Saturday, September 30, 2023 Supervisor Canavan moved to approve the assistance. Supervisor Scheuren seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Public Comment

Scott Bamford, Northfield Drive, asked what happens to any excess funds that are made at the Golf Course. Chairman Bergman explained that any funds over and above the operating costs have been used to pay down the golf courses outstanding debt.
